



Glacier Park 101

- Glacier National Park Established in May 11, 1910.
- Going to the Sun Road stretches 50 miles on a two lanes highway winding through the heart of Glacier Park, completed in 1932. Takes 2 hours to drive full 50 miles.
- 762 lakes, 464' depth of Lake McDonald which is 9.4 miles long, 1.5 miles wide
- 2,865 Miles of streams
- 24 fish species, including 18 native and seven no -native
- 71 species of mammals, including grizzly, bears, wolves, moose, pikas, mountain goats
- 277 documented species of birds
- 1,132 species of plants
- 1,583 square miles of land and a elevation gain 3,165' from Avalanche to Logan pass
- 700+ miles of trails,
- 1,014 campsites with 13 designated campgrounds
- 25 named remaining glaciers (shrinking down from 150 in mid 19th century)
- Tallest Peaks: Mt. Cleveland 10,479, Mt. Stimson, 10,141, Mt. Jackson 10,052, Mt. Merritt 10,003
- Average depth of snow at Logan Pass: 80 feet, takes 10 weeks to plow an clear road for summer
- Length of East Side Tunnel: 408 feet, length or west tunnel: 192 feet
